

Michael D. Mastrandrea is the Deputy Director, Science, of the IPCC Working Group II TSU. He provides scientific expertise to both the IPCC WGII co-chairs and to the Task Group on Data and Scenario Support for Impact and Climate Analysis (TGICA). His research focuses on integrated modeling of the climate and society, climate change impacts and vulnerability assessment, and treatment of uncertainty in climate change projections and climate policy decision making, as well as the accurate and effective communication of scientific research to public and private decision makers and the general public.

He was a researcher at the Woods Institute for the Environment at Stanford University prior to joining the TSU, and remains an Assistant Consulting Professor at the Woods Institute. Mastrandrea received his Ph.D. from the Interdisciplinary Graduate Program in Environment and Resources (IPER) at Stanford. He was a Contributing Author for the WGII chapter on Assessing Key Vulnerabilities and the Risk from Climate Change, and the WGIII chapter on Issues Related to Mitigation in the Long Term for the AR4. He also serves on the Editorial Board for the journal *Climatic Change*.
